First handlers are required to file this report monthly. The original of the report must be mailed to the National Mango Promotion Board, with full remittance, within 15 days after the end of the month in which the sale or non-sale transfer subject to assessments under part 1206. All reports are held in strict confidence by the National Mango Promotion Board.
