700 g. Small-stature, 'Alphonso' flavor, beautiful, disease tolerant, consistent, productive (100-150 lbs/tree), good shelf life.



Carioca

850 g. Citrus and pina colada, small-stature, consistent, productive (100lb/tree), disease tolerant.

King Lion



800 g. Northern
India-Myanmar
flavor, manageable
tree, productive
(150 lb/tree),
disease tolerant.

600 g. Flavor speaks to Borneo, small-stature, productive (150 lb/tree), consistent, disease tolerant and excellent shelf life.

tolerant and good shelf
